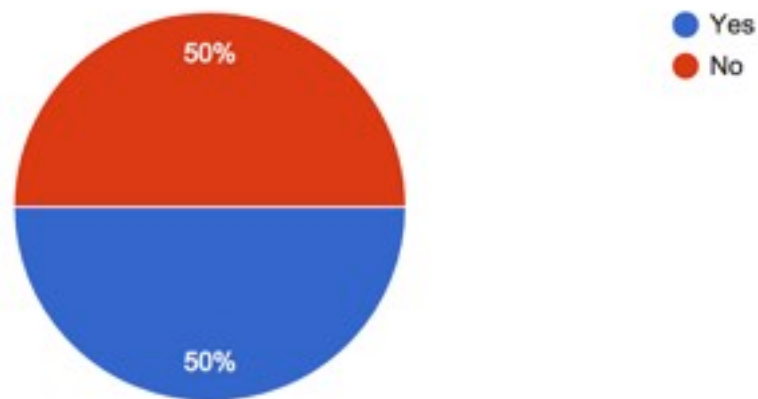

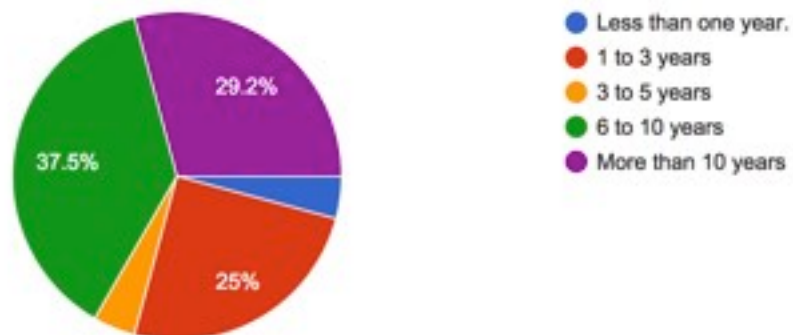

How long have you worked in a Jesuit school?

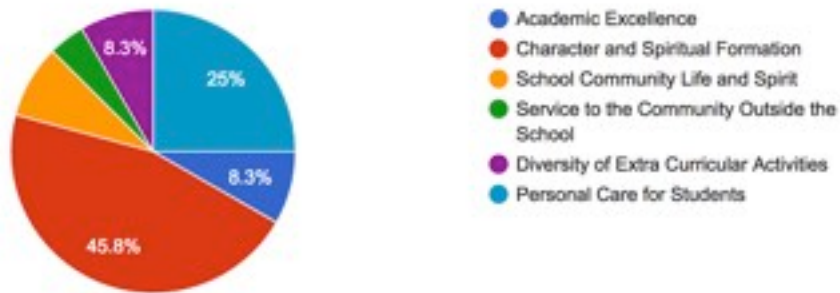

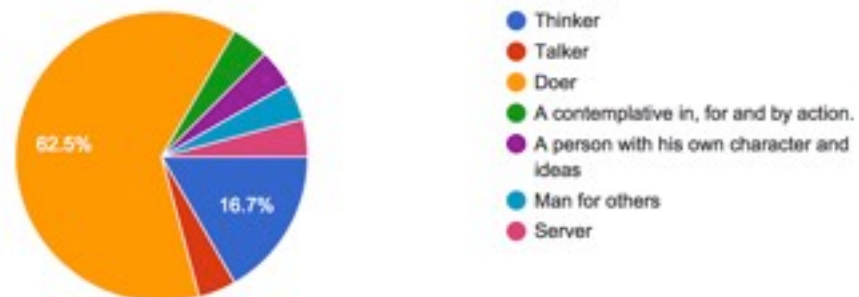

What is the best description for a graduate of a Jesuit school?

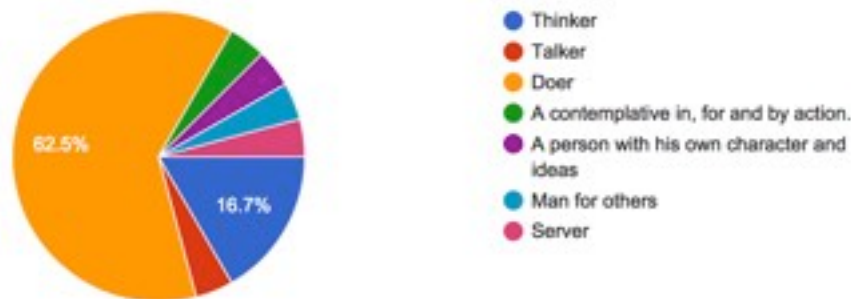
